The award is reserved for an Arrowman who demonstrates to fellow Arrowmen that he or she memorializes in his or her everyday life the spirit of achievement as described by founder E. Urner Goodman and cofounder Carroll A. Edson. At the Lodge Banquet, Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge presented Bill Jones with the award for 2005.

James E. West Fellowship

James E. West was appointed to the position of Chief Scout Executive in 1910 by the founding leadership of Scouting in America. West worked with Sir Robert Baden-Powell, Daniel Carter Beard, Ernest T. Seton, and many interested community leaders to give direction to the infant program of Boy Scouts of America. On January 2, 1911, West and others formed the National Council, B.S.A. Under his leadership over the next 33 years, Scouting grew and matured into the program we recognize and enjoy today. The James E. West Fellowship Award is bestowed on all individuals who donate at least \$1,000 to the Endowment Fund. Every year since 2002, Aal-Pa-Tah has donated \$1000 in the name of a Scouter who has shown exceptional service to the Scouting Program. Debbie Clineman was selected as the recipient of the Fellowship for 2005.
