Want to camp at a National Forest for a week, meet Arrowmen from around the country and have the time of your life? If so, then you want to go to ArrowCorps<sup>5</sup>.

## ARROWCORPS<sup>5</sup>

*A HIGHER ADVENTURE*

Next summer, 5000 members of the Order of the Arrow and the U.S. Forest Service will team up to provide service to five sites across the country over five weeks. This national endeavor is called ArrowCorps<sup>5</sup> and will be one of the most ambitious projects the Order has ever undertaken. The goal is to have a thousand Arrowmen at each site to provide cheerful service to our national forests. One of our contingents will be at the George Washington and Jefferson National Forest located north of Covington Virginia, June 21-28. We will be constructing forty-nine miles of multi-use trail and making campsite improvements. Recreational opportunities include whitewater rafting, fishing, mountain biking and nearby historical sites. Also, there will likely be a second contingent traveling to the Mark Twain National Forest in Missouri on June 7-14 which T.K. Summer Camp Staff members will be able to attend. A \$100 deposit will hold your spot. The estimated cost is \$295, which may change depending on fundraising opportunities. The Lodge is providing scholarships to help some members attend this trip, but these opportunities are few and go fast.
