Brothers, This will be my last time writing in this column of the quarterly Gator Tales. A lot has happened over the last two years during which I have had the opportunity to serve as your Chief. Over 300 new Arrowmen were inducted into our Lodge. The North and South combined to form the Mega Scout show; Aal-Pa-Tah combined both the Pig Roast and the Turkey Fry at the event. Arrowmen from our Lodge “answered the call” when we were asked to serve at the annual Council Banquet dinner. Aal-Pa-Tah also aided when we were needed to clean up after the SAW event, the largest weekend for the Gulf Stream Council. The Order of the Arrow stood by our Council during the clean-up of “Scout Lake” while Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge experienced conflict with another program that threatened the very existence of our Order in the Gulf Stream Council. A new 5 year Lodge Strategic Plan has been approved by the L.E.C. and the Council Executive Board. More hours of service were performed by Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge this year for both Gulf Stream Council and the community than ever before. A new list of Troop OA representatives has been made which will improve the communication between our Lodge and the Scout Troops in the Gulf Stream Council. A new ceremonies team competed

at Section Conference and came back with many awards including Honor Ceremonies Team status in every category. Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge was declared the Best-All-Around Lodge for Section S-4S for the first time! It is safe to say that Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge has had many victories in the last 2 years as we continue to grow stronger. As I sit here in the OA Lodge Building looking through old photographs of Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge in the 1980’s I can truly see how we have evolved.



These last few years have not been easy for me, and I thank you for your cooperation and understanding while I have completed the EMT course, the Paramedic program, and the Fire Academy. I am now happy to announce that I have officially been hired as a full-time Paramedic Firefighter with the City of Palm Springs, FL. I have already experienced several real fire calls and hundreds of medical calls where I apply the knowledge of first aid, which I learned in the Scouts. The Boy Scouts of America and the Order of the Arrow have taught me many things; problem solving, communication, teamwork, delegation, and respect, and I continue to use these skills in my daily life. If I were to use this time to thank everyone who has helped in the successes of the Lodge, the list would be endless. I simply would like to thank all of you for allowing me to serve as your Chief and leader.

Over the last few months of my term as Chief, I plan to attend a District round table meeting in each District. At this visit, I will have a presentation about the OA for all of the Scout leaders in attendance. I hope to be able to inform the new Scout leaders about the OA and our purpose as well as to improve the communication between the OA and the Scout units. The L.E.C. of Aal-Pa-Tah has decided to nominate all of the Scoutmasters in the Gulf Stream Council who meet the long term camping requirement for membership in the OA. This should serve to strengthen the friendship between the OA and Scout Troops.

Although I am turning 21 soon and I will no longer be considered a youth in the Order of the Arrow, I still plan on taking on many roles in the Lodge. Aal-Pa-Tah will be hosting Section Seminars in November, where hundreds of Arrowmen from Florida and Georgia will attend a weekend of OA seminars and a Pow-Wow, and in 4 years, we will once again host Section Conference at TK. A lot of work still needs to be done, and I look forward to working with each of you in the future.

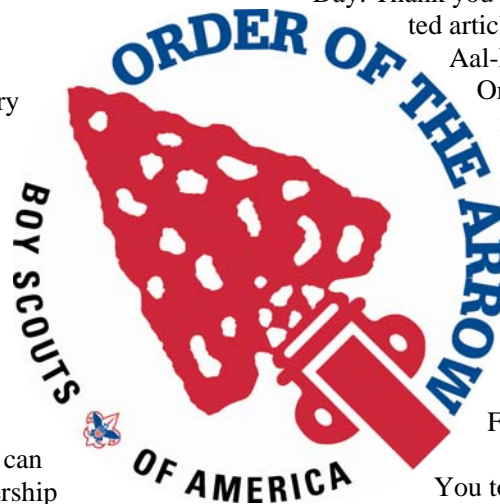

What is Brotherhood?

After 10 months as an Ordeal member in the Order, you can seal your membership by becoming a Brotherhood member. At each Lodge weekend, Arrowmen have an opportunity to seal their membership and become Brotherhood members. Those who would like to complete their Brotherhood will need to do the following:

1. Be an active registered member for at least 10 months
2. Memorize the O.A. Obligation, Song, Admonition, Handclasp, and Sign of Ordeal membership
3. Gain a thorough understanding of the Ordeal through which you passed
4. Write a letter to Lodge Secretary explaining:
 - a. Your interpretation of the O.A. Obligation
 - b. Describe how you have fulfilled, and will continue to fulfill, the Obligation in your Troop or Team and in your daily life.
 - c. How you have used your understanding of the Ordeal to aid in service to the Lodge
 - d. Describe your specific plans for giving service in the Lodge
5. Register for Brotherhood prior to weekend and pay the additional \$14 fee at or before the weekend

Why would you want to Seal your Membership in the OA and become a Brotherhood Member?

Well the answer to that is simple. Brotherhood Membership is considered as full membership in the OA. Do not worry, all of you Ordeal Members are still in the OA. Brotherhood Membership gives you a total understanding of the Order of the Arrow. Additionally it helps our Lodge in Section competitions and Quality Lodge Recognition. The Lodge Building



How much do you know about that white building at T.K. that sits just outside of the OA Ring? I bet you know a lot less than you think. The Lodge Building, when it was originally built, was just a concrete platform like the pavilions in the campsites. At some point in time a Health Lodge was built on top of the platform and served as the first aid center for T.K. for many years. Around 1995, after the new Health Lodge was built by the parking lot, the old one was donated to Aal-Pa-Tah by Gulf Stream Council to serve as our Lodge Building and has done so since that time.

Over the past 2 years, many renovations have been made to the OA Lodge Building at Camp Tanah Keeta.

These improvements include:

- New Paint (Inside and Outside)
- New Insulated Drywall Ceiling
- New Baseboards, Trim and Crown molding
- New Toilet, Mirror, and Shower Curtain in bathroom
- New Couch
- New Blinds for Windows
- New Desk for Lodge Chief
- New Compaq Computer
- New Flat Screen Monitor
- New Laser Scanner/ Printer
- New High Speed Internet
- with Wireless Router in Lodge Building

All of the new Awards and plaques that Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge has received over the last 10 years are also proudly on display inside the Lodge.

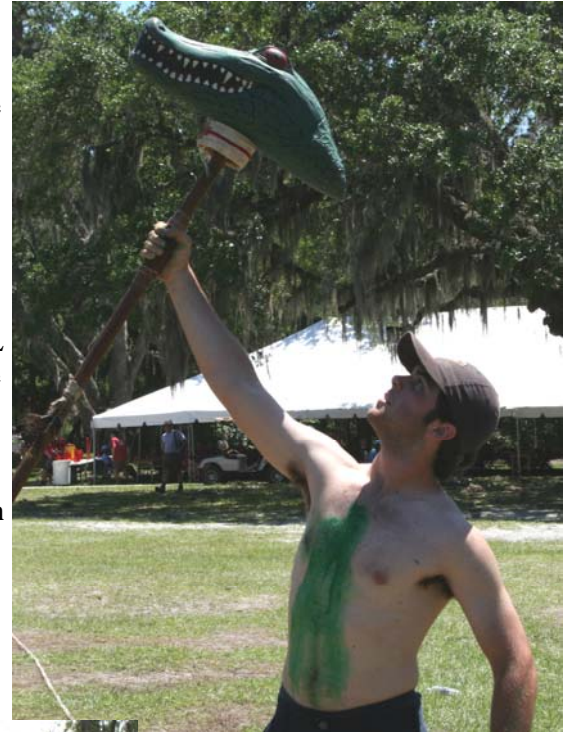

NOAC 2009

It's coming!! It's the best thing in Scouting next to a National Jamboree or getting your Eagle. It will be Saturday, August 1st through Thursday, August 6th 2009. This event will be held in Bloomington, Indiana at Indiana University. It looks to be a great time with lots of interesting things to do and if you are not careful you might just have fun or learn something.

Some interesting things came from the meeting at Section Conference. They are reinstating the 2 to 1 ratio (2 youth to 1 adult) again because there is a cap on attendance due to the size of the University. We should be receiving our allotment in October 08 with deposits due in January 2009. That seems to be a long time away but it will creep up real fast. Also, they expect transportation to be the biggest expense (surprise – not) due to the high cost of fuel. National will be coming online with their webpage soon, but right now they are fully focused on ArrowCorps⁵.

Some Lodges have already started taking deposits and making calls for transportation. An airplane ride from West Palm to Bloomington is already somewhere around \$575 and expected to rise. Bus transportation is worse with diesel at \$4.25 and climbing. One Lodge was given an estimate at \$900 per Arrowman but could not get anything in writing. Most transportation places will not even talk to you yet about August 08. We are going to need to do some serious fundraising to help with this.

Some things that were discussed were operating our Gator Grille at things like MEGA Show, SAW, Webelos Woods and other Council gatherings, and possibly doing it at times during Summer Camp (Wednesday or Friday evenings?) when it might be feasible. Also, a fund raising patch that we can sell to everyone in the Council, Cub Scouts included. Time is now to start on this project and we need to get out of the box with our thinking.

Let's all start thinking early and get ahead of the ball. If we wait much longer we will be late. Bring your ideas to our Elected Officers and get them motivated.

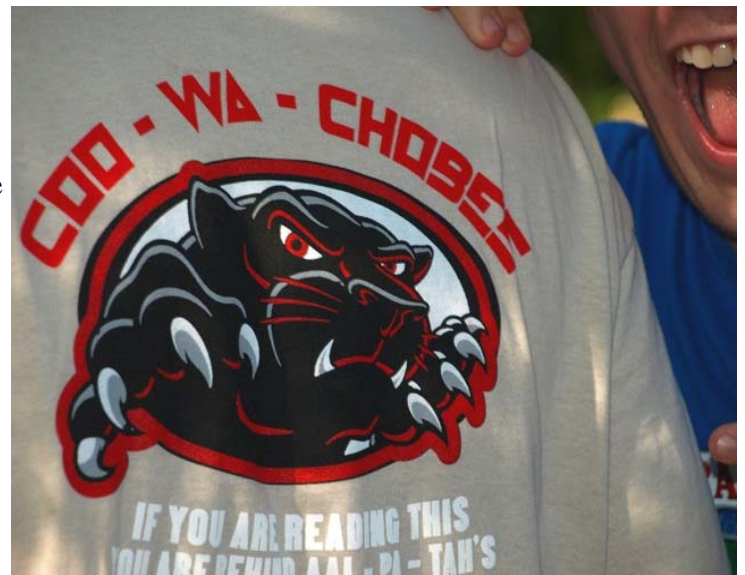

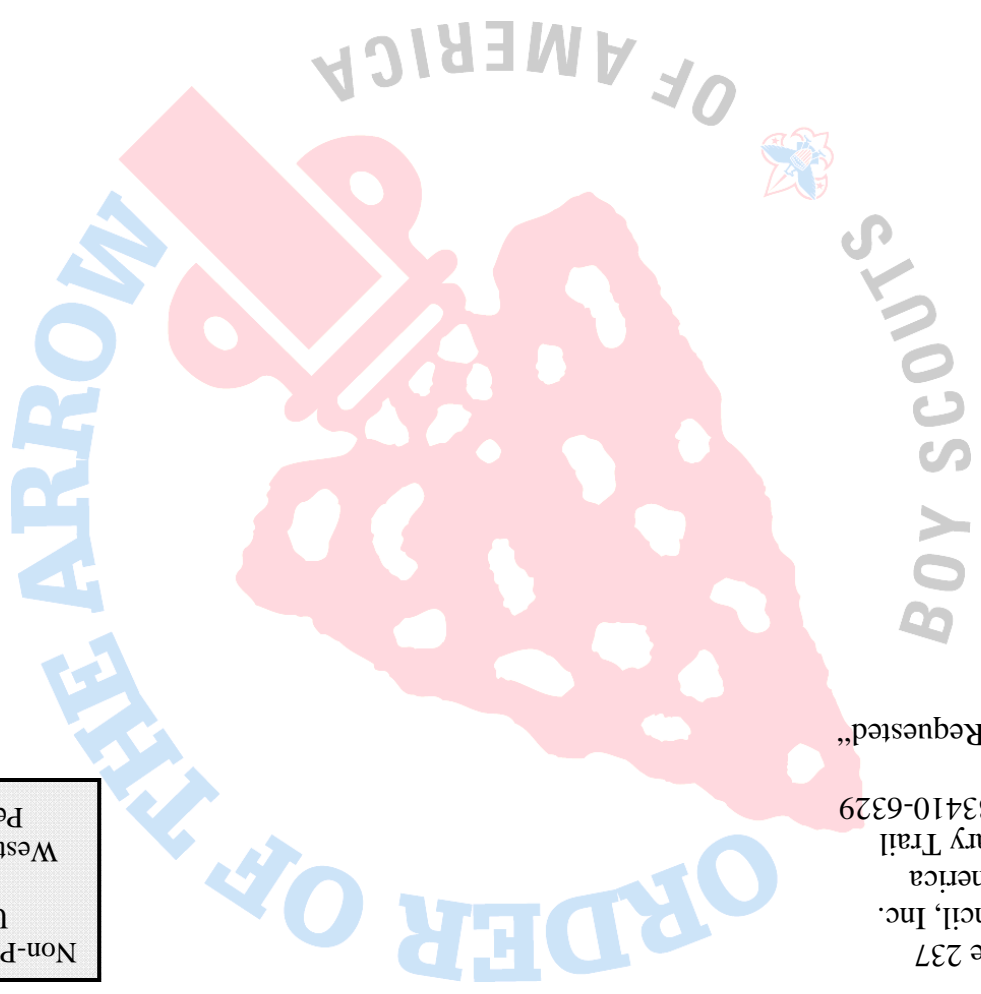
Service/Ordeal Weekend 2008
