Adviser's Minute

I have a confession. I was once one of THOSE mothers (and Scout leaders) that felt competition was bad. I was all for everyone getting a trophy. Why? I just hated to see anyone lose. But, my opinion today regarding competition has done a 180°. How did I get to this point?

As I got older, I began to start taking my health seriously. I started to run, but I wasn't too good at it and I was constantly injured. Mark Luttier, our Council President, good friend, and an avid runner, heard about my new "running" hobby. He suggested that I compete in some races, saying that "the only way you get better as a runner is to compete from time to time." Word got out and a Scout in my Troop suggested The Race for The Pies. He noted that it was for beginners. Reluctantly I signed up. I started off feeling pretty good. I expected to be passed by younger people, maybe even some fit older people, but lots of people passed me. Among those was a pregnant lady running with a baby in a stroller! But the icing on the cake was when a 75-ish gray-haired grandma ran past me like a gazelle somewhere around mile 2.5. I barely finished that race and I felt like a bit of a failure. Then I thought "What would it take to get better?" Well, that one dismal race set me on a different path. I have read and studied, talked to people and learned a lot about running — things like cadence, proper breathing, core exercises, and proper form. While I will likely never "win" a race, I have been "winning" on a regular basis, achieving better times, feeling good, and running injury free. The real lessons I learned through this are that it is important to go out of your comfort zone, it is important to be resilient in the face of failure and if we want to get better at something we need to be able to look at failure and use it as a self-assessment opportunity.

So how does this relate to Scouting? In Scouting we see competition of all sorts - games, patrol competitions, Troop competitions and even elections. In fact, we just came back from Section Conference which is nothing but a whole weekend of competitions! So how can we use competition as a learning tool? First we need to not be afraid to get in the game, run for an office, or enter a competition. It is important to grow and growth comes from being pushed outside of one's comfort zone. It is important to know that in any competition, some will win and some will not win (aka lose). While it is important to be a good winner, it is equally important to learn how to be a good loser. And in fact, losing is something everyone NEEDS from time to time. It teaches an important life skill – resiliency!!! Don't we all want to be able to cope in life when things don't go our way? Losing at a game, or losing a Troop election teaches us to shake off a loss, and move on. These things prepare us for the real life challenges we may face.

The most important thing we can take away from competitions is there is something to learn in every loss. Competition gives us an opportunity for honest self-reflection. For example, if you don't win an election, rather than place blame it is wise to reflect "why was the other candidate selected?" followed up with "what can I do to become a better choice as a leader?" Being able to self-reflect and make improvements is what makes us better people.

So, don't be afraid of competition. Use it is a learning tool, a way to grow and learn. Understand that in losing you can truly win!!!


