The Order strives to strengthen Scouting's foundation of service by further fostering in Arrowmen the ethic of servant leadership. By promoting and rewarding service that benefits the Boy Scouts of America's outdoor program, and the communities in which Scouts reside, the Order will be acting to support Scouting at the most important level.

### Requirements:

- \* Give 8 hours of service. Service may be split over two or more events.

- \* Give 6 hours of service doing a community service project planned and run by the lodge or chapter.

Attending the June Service Weekend satisfies most of the requirements for this award.

# Officer Reports

Brothers,

Wait, before I begin, let us celebrate the awesome Section Conference that our lodge totally kicked butt in and took all the great prizes from! WOO-HOO! Okay, now I can start.

Brothers,

As your Vice Chief-elect of program, I feel that it is important to do now what I do not think I had time to do when we held elections at Spring Pow-Wow.

I'd like to take time to tell you what exactly my goals are for this term of office and exactly what I hope to do for you and for all of the future members of Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge #237.

Firstly, and I think my fellow elected officers will agree, we want to get our Lodge membership and attendance at weekends up. Do you know that there are over 500 dues paid members of Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge but only about 150 to 200 active members? Few lodge members will remember that there was a time when it was a strange thing to have as little as 250 attendees to a lodge weekend. The lodge was running an average of 350 to 400 active members. The Lodge weekends were festivals of Brotherhood, Cheerfulness, and Service. No job was too difficult because one always had plenty of friends to get the work done with. Today those numbers seem to us a far and distant goal. My fellow officers and I believe that with the right planning and hard work, we can get our weekends back to how they were and maybe even take it a step further. The key factor of achieving this goal is the Chapter. Chapters are the building blocks of a Lodge. In the past several years our Chapters have grown weary and attendance has dropped from each. We will

work with the Chapter Chiefs to motivate their Chapters and to get non-active members back into the spirit of the Order of the Arrow thus gaining more attendance at Lodge weekends, thus making the weekends more fun, and thus making our Lodge better!

I was a Weekend Chairman once. Do not get me wrong, it was great position, but it is very, extremely, excruciatingly difficult. My goal for this next term is to make the position much easier for the person who volunteers to take on the job. In the past, the position of the Weekend

Chairman has been to plan, get ready for, carry-out

and clean up after the weekend he is in charge of. That is a lot of work for one person to do! I do not care

if you are Superman, you cannot do it alone. What I plan to do is to create

and utilize a system that will help the Weekend

Chairman build committees which will

take most of the work off of him. The

job of planning must be spread out over

many people so that the person in charge is

not swamped with work. If the person in

charge does everything then something will be forgotten in the planning

process and that something may

be as little as making sure there are enough schedules for everyone attending or as big as plan-

ning for 200 people for dinner Saturday night when there are 500 people at the weekend. I believe that making the

position of Weekend Chairman an easier position will not only help the person but will also make the Lodge week-

ends better. As they say, "Two heads are better than one", but if the Weekend Chairman has a dozen committees for

the weekend, then a dozen heads are better than one.

The Induction process of the Order of the Arrow is supposed to inspire Scouts and Scouters to Cheerfully Serve his Brother. This is evident in the Elangomat program,



the Spirit of the Arrow booklets, the Ordeal weekend, and the Ordeal ceremonies. All of these things add up to what inspires the Ordeal candidates to stay with the Lodge and stay in Scouting. How many of your Elangomats stayed in contact with you after your Ordeal to make sure you showed up at the next weekends and made sure you got your Brotherhood? How many of you remember who your Elangomat was? How many of you still have your Spirit of the Arrow booklets? How many of you know what the Spirit of the Arrow booklets are? How many of you went through your Ordeal thinking, I paid \$65 to come out here and not eat, not talk, work hard, and get no sleep in the middle of nowhere? How many of you remember the Legend of the Lenni Lenape and the origin of the Order of the Arrow that Meteu told you in your Ordeal? The Inductions process should be on of the top priorities of a Lodge. I want to make our Inductions process better in order to get that inspiration to the hearts of these Ordeal candidates so that they are committed members of the Lodge right off the bat.

## In Memory of Ray Simpson

Brother Ray Simpson joined Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge more than forty-five years ago. A welder by trade, he was responsible for numerous projects at Tanah Keeta over the last four and a half decades. A few of the projects that can be seen today are the tent racks in the boathouse, the mounting brackets for each of the patch boards and the interior stairwell of the climbing tower. Perhaps one of the more interesting projects was when he shortened the old flagpole that used to be on the west side of the dining hall. A few scouts had gotten a little carried away while trying to replace the rope and the pole was bent in two places. Ray had the flagpole carried to the maintenance yard where he cut out the sections and it back together. A Vigil Honor member, Ray will be missed by the lodge, camp and council. When I was a youth, having just joined the lodge, I remember going out with Ray and his truck of tools to work on platform repairs in the campsites. We did not get to just stand around and watch him work, he showed us how to do it and then expected us to follow his example (except the welding). Work days to him started at 6 am and he would show up to the camp maintenance yard before we were awake and had breakfast. Ray did a lot of things behind the scenes that most people never saw, but he will be missed by all who new him.

We'll see you June 2-4th, to share in brotherhood, cheerfulness and service with your fellow Gators!

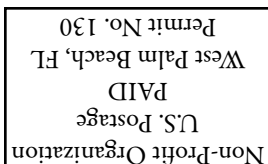
