Winter Fellowship is coming up, this is a great chance for our lodge to move back into the swing of things, and show our



agree in that there were some of the best trainers from around the region there, including our Section S-4S Chief, Travis Sheehan, our Southern Region


Chief, and our National Chief, Patrick Murphy, who travelled all the way from Arizona to be there. The weekend was packed full of training, all of it tied to
