#### **Old Business**

### I. Officer Reports

- A. Vice Chief of Program (Stephanie C.)- Program and activities for Spring Ordeal
  - 1. Emailed a contact regarding medieval-themed programs.
  - 2. Working on a corkboard for shows.
  - 3. Planning field activities, including infiltration and capture the flag.
  - 4. Needs to discuss food services with Maddy (believe it may have already been arranged).
  - 5. Wants to ask Tess about opening the archery range for competitive shooting.
  - 6. Pool noodle jousting is unlikely to be allowed; Mrs. Webb suggested an alternative: flag jousting (using football flags instead of contact).
  - 7. Currently does not have a weekend chair. Will reach out to those who have signed up to determine availability.

#### B. Vice Chief of Inductions (Charlie T.) inductions stand-in during ceremonies

- 1. February Ordeal (2/7-2/8) went well; now preparing for Spring Ordeal.
- 2. New ceremonialist, Phillip, will perform 1-2 ceremonies.
- 3. Still need one more person to assist Gio, Daly, and Brightman with guiding candidates.
- 4. A minor burn occurred at TK; a hanging branch in the Ordeal ring needs to be removed for safety.
- 5. Ordeal was successful; 56 candidates attended, all arrived safely without getting lost.

## C. Vice Chief of Administration (Dennis C., reported by Brady Kondek)

- Lauren now has access to social media account within Office 365, and posts have been going up.
- 2. January Gator Tales went out on 1/29, had 128 online views (excluding anything offline).
- 3. February Gator Tales on-pace to be completed within the next week to week and a half.
- 4. Brady mentioned that he will be here and there across the next 4ish weeks due to running a convention at his University. Gator Tales will still be put together as per normal, but just in case if anyone reaches out there may be delays in response here and there.

#### 5. Website Discussion

- a) Brady re-initiated the conversation about the future of the lodge website.
- b) Mrs. Webb stated that she talked to Mr. Ulrich, and determined that we pay around \$350 per year to use Wix to host our current site,

- and that it is costing the lodge a lot of money to keep that up and running.
- c) Mrs. Webb also stated an idea of fully moving the site onto the council's website, which is powered by Tentaroo, and could be a couple of pages on there with some photos and related information. The current aalpatah.org domain would simply redirect to the council page here.
- d) Brady brought up another idea, which he had talked to about with Dennis previously, on using DreamHost, which offers a free non-profit plan, to host a WordPress or Drupal site. The only initial base cost would be for the annual domain registration, which would be paid for anyway to keep the emails going, and to redirect to the council page if that option were to be fully implemented.

  Beyond that, premium options such as premium themes or plugins (such as Elementor Pro) would cost additional money, but aren't necessarily required.
- e) The key action item following this discussion is for Brady and Dennis to schedule a one-off meeting with lodge leadership to discuss this further in-depth.

#### D. Vice Chief of Service (Colton M.) - Service projects and update from TKIC

- 1. Catching up on past emails after regaining access.
- 2. February Ordeal service projects went well but lacked enough work for the number of people present.
- 3. Contacted his quartermaster, who will attend Spring Ordeal and future events.
- 4. Stairs Project Update

- a) Ranger Rick confirmed the stairs cannot be replaced at this time.
- b) Project requires a full weekend, or a significant chunk of the day, to safely remove and replace the old stairs.
- c) Due to ongoing construction projects, it's best to postpone until Summer Fellowship unless enough volunteers can be gathered soon.
- d) Woody suggested holding off until May, for Summer Fellowship.
- 5. Spring Ordeal and Additional Service Projects
  - a) 136 people are currently registered for Spring Ordeal, so multiple service projects are needed.
  - b) Discussed incorporating the Camporee service project-- awaiting further details from Mrs. Webb, which are to come soon.
