


Happy holidays and may the new year be good to each and every one of us.

And a Word about N.O.A.C. 98

The next National Order of the Arrow Conference will be held at the University of Iowa in August, 1998. The NOAC will feature Native American Events and Competitions, Excellent Training, Incredible Shows, and the opportunity to meet Arrowmen from around the country.

You should plan NOW to attend NOAC 98. The estimated cost is \$700. However, you can reduce the impact of this cost by starting your payments now. You can start payments any time for any amount, as long as the \$700 is paid by June, 1998. For example, monthly payments starting December 1996 and ending May 1998 would require a monthly payment of only \$39.

Not sure you can commit that far ahead? All money is completely refundable until Dec. 1997, but deposits started now can guarantee your spot on the contingent.
